In support of New Zealand's International Education Strategy, we invite New Zealand classes to join a junior youth global citizenship summit hosted by the Shenzhen Education Bureau (government) for schools in China. It is held in the city of Shenzhen and they are keen for some New Zealand classes to join the event online. It is for Year 6 – 10 classes (ages 10 – 14).

Students will be introduced to an E-Pal before the event so that experiences, lifestyles and thoughts can be shared. This is a very unique culturally engaging event covering important topics for two hours each day. The long-term plan is for a group of New Zealand students to attend the summit in Shenzhen from 2022/2023.

Support is provided to assist introductions. Discussions about each other's country, family and school life, language, COVID and life during lock-down, differences and similarities. Template provided and introductions commence 26 July 2021.</p>

Day one, Tuesday 17 August 2021	<p>Session 1: 1.00pm – 3.00pm Introductions and student/class interaction.</p> <p>Class/school introductions and presentations, group language speaking skills (Mandarin and English). Facilitated by New Zealand teacher.</p>
Day two, Wednesday 18 August 2021	<p>Session 2: Opening Ceremony: 1.00pm – 2.00pm</p> <p>Official government attendees from China and New Zealand.</p> <p>New Zealand and Chinese student attendance to observe Chinese protocols, customs and ceremonial procedures.</p> <p>One student from each country presents a speech about their COVID experience and what they think can be done to manage future pandemics.</p>
	<p>Session 3: 2.00pm – 3.00pm Global Citizens of the Future</p> <p>Two school Principals (China and New Zealand) will describe what it means to be a global citizen and why it is important for juniors to understand. Classes and groups will then discuss global citizenship and present their views.</p>
Day three, Thursday 19 August 2021	<p>Session 4: 1.00pm – 2.00pm Global Leaders of the Future</p> <p>Some global citizens will become global leaders. What qualities do we expect from a global leader?</p> <p>Presentation, group workshop and report back.</p>
	<p>Session 5: 2.00pm – 3.00pm My Country, My People</p> <p>Four students (two from each country) give a presentation about their country followed by questions and answers about differences and similarities.</p>
